

SPANISH SUMMER CAMP FOR CHILDREN AGED 7 TO 13

This course lasts at least one week during the months of June, July, and August and is designed for boys and girls aged 7 to 13. The course runs from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and consists of two parts: one in the classroom and one outside the classroom.

This course is designed as a fun and immersive experience in the city of Madrid, where language learning takes place in a natural, dynamic, and enjoyable way. For 4 hours a day, Monday through Friday, students participate in activities tailored to their age and level: the first two hours take place in the classroom through creative workshops, vocabulary games, communication exercises, crafts, songs, and cooperative activities that foster comprehension and oral expression in Spanish. The following two hours are dedicated to cultural and recreational outings around Madrid—museums, parks, markets, squares, and other points of interest—always accompanied by the teacher and using Spanish as the language of communication at all times. The main objective is not traditional academic learning, but rather for children to experience the language in an experiential, active, and motivating way, gaining confidence and familiarity with Spanish while discovering the culture and daily life of the city.

SPANISH SUMMER CAMP FOR TEENAGERS AGED 14 TO 17

This course lasts a minimum of one week during the months of June, July, and August and is designed for young people aged 14 to 17. The course runs from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., with daily activities starting at 2:00 p.m.

This program combines learning, communication, and cultural immersion in an international and dynamic environment. Classes are held Monday through Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in small groups organized according to each student's Spanish level and shared with peers of the same age. The course takes a primarily practical and communicative approach, with activities designed to encourage participation, build confidence, and promote real-world language use through discussions, projects, games, group dynamics, and content related to culture, music, daily life, and the interests of teenagers.

In addition, every afternoon from 2:00 to 4:00 PM, students participate in cultural and recreational activities outside the classroom—visits to museums, iconic neighborhoods, swimming pools, cultural venues, parks, markets, or sports and creative activities—always accompanied by teachers and using Spanish as the language of communication. The program is rounded out with a field trip every Saturday to a city near Madrid, offering participants the opportunity to continue discovering Spanish culture while practicing the language in a natural, active, and fun way.
